## **COVER LETTER**

To,

The Management,

**SKANS Schools of Accountancy.** 

This AFC September 2021 Session content report contains comprehensive performance review of coordination and student's affairs department, exam department, IT department, Accounts department, academics department/teaching faculty and Governance department.

In this session, we have only one batch i.e., batch#4. So, it appeared in ICAP AFC September 2021 exam.

Batch#4 was started on 12<sup>th</sup> April, 2021 and initially classes were conducted physically at campus. However, due to restrictions imposed by Govt. of Pakistan, classes were shifted online from 20<sup>th</sup> April, 2021 to 6<sup>th</sup> May, 2021. Once, the restrictions were eased out, we shifted towards physical classes and for **most part of the session, this batch studied at campus**. However, during the session, on two separate occasions, we had to shift again towards online mode from 7<sup>th</sup> June, 2021 to 12<sup>th</sup> June, 2021 due to Govt. orders and 7<sup>th</sup> September, 2021 to 11<sup>th</sup> September, 2021 **due to ACCA CBTs.** 

We had total 32 students enrolled in Batch#4. However, in the start of session, Miss Faiza Malik left SKANS due to financial/family reasons and hence did not continue studies. Her case was dealt as per SOPs and timely adjustments were made in the database. So, active students were 31.

Further, Miss Seemab Massey got injured due to an accident and had to defer for December, 2021 attempt, Mr. Ubedullah just attended few classes of QMS and became Ghost, and Mr. Talha Khan got sick due to COVID and after recovery, he opted for self-study from home during the second half of session.

Only Mr. Talha Khan was a fee defaulter in September 2021 session and has Rs. 3,200/- balance amount. Coordinators did follow-ups for fee recovery but as he was doing self-study at home, he did not join campus again and did not submit remaining fee.

The coordinators, teachers, exam department and Governance department made strong follow-ups (mainly through WhatsApp and SKANS Mobile App messages). To make sure the presence of students in the classes as well as in tests. In total, 2,368 system-based absentee's messages (Source report name: Absent student follow-up) were sent to the parents (April 12<sup>th</sup> 2021 to May 25<sup>th</sup> 2021), and for test absentee's, 405 system-based test absentee's messages (Source report name: SMS Log) were sent to the parents (April 27<sup>th</sup> 2021 to September 15<sup>th</sup> 2021).

Despite COVID issues and certain limitations, as per instructions of top management, physical PTMs were conducted for batch#4 (31st August and 1st September, 2021). The coordinators timely intimated and invited Parents through SKANS Mobile App regarding PTM three days before the event date and parents' feedback was taken through system. Specifically for this batch, 27 parents attended the meeting and provided system-based feedback (Source report name: Parents Feedback-Details). Further, system-based Teacher evaluation was also conducted on 5th August 2021. Overall, satisfactory response was received for all teachers. Teacher evaluation summary-overall is presented in admissions and students affair section and teacher wise evaluation is presented in teaching faculty section against each teacher of batch#4.

At least 7-8 Tests of each AFC subject were conducted for this batch and strong follow-ups were made as discussed above to ensure higher presence rate in tests/Mocks. To increase participation rate, tests were re-uploaded upon teachers request so that absent/fail students can attempt it. For most part of the session, class attendance and test participation remained good around 85% students participated in each test on average. However as mentioned above, test participation rate was low in the last few weeks as syllabus was completed by that time (around 31st August 2021) and students opted for self-preparation from home.

As syllabus was mainly completed for all AFC subjects around 31st August, 2021, so, students opted for self-study and thus, in the last few weeks of the session, attendance (class and tests) was reported low.

Some technical issues related to testing application/portal were reported by the students and Exam department, which were timely discussed with the IT department and efforts were made to improve the application and technical issues. However, one issue still exist i.e., difference in number of questions for students of same batch/subject in each test.

Total 109 papers were enrolled for September 2021 attempt (31 students). However, out of these, 102 papers (94%, 29 students) were attempted in September attempt. The remaining 2 students



(6%, 7 papers) did not appear in exams due to different reasons which are mentioned above. Further, an overall average pass percentage of 83% (90 papers out of 109) was achieved (as per Mr. Qasim Shuja formula, an overall 88% overall pass percentage was achieved), and only 12% (12 out of 102 attempted papers) students failed in September 2021 ICAP exams. Overall, out of 31 students, 25 students cleared AFC (81%) and out of these around, 60% students have enrolled for CAF subjects. However, an increase is expected in this figure as AFC result has been recently announced.

Further, in September 2021 session, all problematic students were timely identified and dealt as per SOPs and adjustments were made accordingly in database for left student. Moreover, despite several reminders from coordinators, one student i.e., Mr. Talha Khan, did not submit his remaining dues of Rs. 3,200/-. Except this student, September 2021 Session-Batch#4 receivables are zero.

#### **KEY POINTS**

- A) Coordinators were in close loop with the students and strong follow-ups has been made to increase class attendance by coordinators and also supported by the teachers (Through WhatsApp Messages and SKANS Mobile App). Further, governance department also supported in follow-up process by sending system-based SMS to absent students (class and test).
- B) At least 7-8 Tests (plus re-tests/re-upload) were uploaded for each subject, however students' participation was around 80%: Intimation and reminders were given to the students/parents by respective teachers and coordinators (through WhatsApp), and exam department and governance department (through SKANS Mobile App).
- C) Lack of technical knowledge at student end: They were guided
- D) Health issues of students: Uncontrollable factor
- E) System based physical PTMs were conducted, and parents' participation rate was very high.
- F) System based teacher evaluation was conducted, however, participation from students was low. Lack of students interest and lack of supervision/follow-up from coordinators was the main reason behind this issue.
- G) Database is up to date and all required adjustment are already made.
- H) Only one fee defaulter case (Receivables)
- I) Overall results are satisfactory especially for BC. However, FE, QMS and IT result should be improved around 90% in future.

- J) Around 6 (out of total 12 fail papers) students are marginally fail like 22/23/24 marks (in FE, BC or IT) and 46/47/48 marks (in QMS) etc.
- K) Limited problematic variables in the September Session 2021.
- L) AFC September 2021 Session Batch#4 was properly closed at system.
- M) Some technical issues related to difference in number of questions for students of same batch/subject in each test.
- N) Disturbance in schedule of tests/mocks due to ACCA CBTs.

#### Subject: AFC SEPTEMBER 2021 SESSION-SKANS F-8 CAMPUS, ISLAMABAD

AFC September 2021 session was started with batch#4 which consisted of total 32 students, however, one student left in the start of session and thus, active students were 31. The coordinators and teachers were advised to do a strong follow-up for absent students. Further, some students were consistently absent in tests, so, teachers and testing department were advised to strictly instruct students to ensure their presence in tests. WhatsApp follow up and SKANS System based SMS App was used with due diligence in this session.

Most of the enrolled students appeared for ICAP September Exam and only one student deferred for December 2021 attempt. All courses were completed in time for batch 4 around 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2021, and teachers has efficiently performed through the syllabus and completed on time. However, the on-campus Mocks exams were disturbed due to the 10 days session of ACCA CBTs from the first week of September 2021.

The overall result of AFC September 2021 Session for SKANS F-8 campus was satisfactory. However, improvements can be made by following:

- A) Although students were advised to do online practice of questions through SKANS portal but participation was low. So, it is recommended to increase students' participation in online practice as well. Similarly, teachers should conduct practice sessions mostly within their classes and supervise it.
- B) Coordinators were in close loop with the students (Through WhatsApp Messages, Calls and SKANS Mobile App) but still improvements are required in order to decrease the low attendance issues that were reported during the session by conducting Monthly PTMs of weak and irregular students (physical or online).

# 4. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE ON ADMISSIONS AND STUDENT AFFAIRS

#### Subject: AFC JUNE 2021 SESSION-ADMISSIONS AND STUDENT AFFAIRS

SKANS F-8 CA department offered 1 batch for AFC September 2021 attempt i.e., Batch#4. In total, we had 112 enrollments (papers) in different AFC subjects. However, 1 student, Miss Faiza Malik (3 papers) left SKANS due to financial issues, so, active students were 31 (109 papers). Some students from Batch#4 had exemptions in Functional English (FE) subject. That's why total enrollment (17 students) was comparatively low in FE subject as compared to other AFC subjects (total 31 students).

For AFC Batch#4 September, 2021, classes were mainly conducted physical at campus. Overall, students' attendance in physical classes were satisfactory around 80%. However, some students had high absence ratio at the end of session. Coordinators were in contact with students/parents through WhatsApp messages, calls and SKANS Mobile App. In total, 2,368 messages were sent to parents of absent students in class (Source report name: Absent student follow-up) (April 12<sup>th</sup> 2021 to May 25<sup>th</sup> 2021), and for test absentee's, 405 system-based test absentee's messages (Source report name: SMS Log) were sent to the parents (April 27<sup>th</sup> 2021 to September 15<sup>th</sup> 2021).

AFC syllabus of September 2021 session batch was covered timely. At least 7-8 Tests for each subject (mainly chapter wise) plus Mocks (after completion of syllabus/section) were conducted. However, due to CBTs in the first week of September, tests scheduled was disturbed. In online testing, some students had internet connection problems at their end, so they faced problems and thus could not attempt tests/Mocks. Strong follow-ups (at teachers end, at coordinators end, at exam department end and at Governance end) were made to increase participation in tests/Mocks and same practice should be followed in future as well.

With prior intimation through SKANS Mobile App, formal system based physical PTMs on 31st

August, 2021 and 1<sup>st</sup> September, 2021 were conducted to share progress of students with their parents. 27/31 parents came for physical PTM (Source report name: Parents Feedback-Details). System based teacher evaluation was also conducted on 5<sup>th</sup> August 2021 (Source report name: Teacher Evaluation). Overall, positive feedback was given by the students. Teacher evaluation statistics have been presented in next section.

Overall, AFC September, 2021 session result is satisfactory (CEO 83% and Mr. Qasim Shuja 88%) However, efforts should be made to achieve 100% result in all subjects and 90%-95% pass percentage should be the minimum acceptable level at SKANS. Further, ICAP overall result statistics are not available till 27<sup>th</sup> October 2021 so comparison with overall ICAP result can't be made.

AFC September 2021 Session batch#4 syllabus was timely completed and it was properly closed at system. Overall, 25/31 students cleared AFC and an overall, 60% conversion rate has been achieved and it is expected that it will further increase to 80% as result has been recently announced and students are coming for enrollment in CAF. Moreover, we are in contact with the deferred case and advised her to visit campus for any guidance and system-based practice.

All discounts and installments cases (if any) were dealt as per SOPs and no favors has been given without formal approvals.




#### 4.1 ADMISSION, COORDINATION AND STUDENT AFFAIRS SECTION

#### 4.1.1 AN OVERVIEW

Batch#4 September 2021 session was started on 12<sup>th</sup> April, 2021 which consisted of total 32 students (112 papers). However, in the start of session, Miss Faiza Malik left studies due to personal reasons/financial issues and thus, active students were 31 (109 papers). Some students from this batch had exemptions in Functional English (FE) subject. That's why total enrollment was comparatively low in FE subject (only 17) as compared to other AFC subjects (total 31). During September 2021 session, I student (Miss Seemab Massey) got injured due to an accident and thus deferred for December attempt and I student (Mr. Talha Khan) got COVID positive and upon recovery, opted for self-study and did not visit campus again to attend classes. He has pending balance of Rs. 3,200/- which could not be recovered despite several reminders from coordinators. Further, 1 student (Mr. Ubedullah) was a repeater and became ghost in the start of session.

Only 1 student (out of total 31 students of September 2021 session), Mr. Talha Khan did not submit Rs. 3,200/- of fee. Coordinators contacted him several times, advised him to clear fee, but he did not. He was COVID positive, opted for self-study and thus, did not visit campus again. He was the only fee defaulter in September 2021 session. Otherwise, receivables are zero.

As, September 2021 session was mainly physical, so physical/formal PTMs were conducted. Further, coordinators were also in communication with the parents through WhatsApp about progress of students like their class attendance, test attendance and test performance etc.

In September 2021 session, system-based Teacher Evaluation was conducted to increase participation rate from students. Overall, good response was received for all AFC teachers.

During the period under review, SMS were sent to parents through SKANS Mobile App (Governance department) and WhatsApp (coordinators). Extensive follow ups in this regard were carried out by coordinators through WhatsApp and WhatsApp calls, and those who didn't respond to our messages and calls, we have done calls through SKANS official PTCL and mobile number. Additionally, we were tracking the students and ensuring their regular present by keeping eyes on such students.



Furthermore, teachers personally during class as well as on WhatsApp group frequently asked the students to make sure their presence. In this regard, Mr. Raheel, Mr. Raees, Mr. Umair and Mr. Hamid were actively in contact with the students. Collectively, we have worked to make it more effective. (where is Dr mahzar for QMS TEACHER OF BATCH #4?)

Governance department also supported actively in student's follow-up process. SMS were actively sent to all those students who were absent in classes through SKANS Mobile App. Same procedure was also applied for those students who were absent in tests.

For September 2021 Session, in total, 2,368 system-based absentee's messages (Source report name: **Absent student follow-up**) were sent to the parents (**April 12**<sup>th</sup> 2021 to May 25<sup>th</sup> 2021). However, this number also includes absent SMS sent to other batches enrolled in September 2021 session.

#### 4.1.3 DEFERRED STUDENTS FOLLOW-UPS

During the period under review, one student i.e., Miss Seemab deferred for December attempt due to health issues. Coordinators and teachers are in contact with her and provided her guidance. Further, as classes are physical, so, she has been offered to visit campus and attempt practice/tests for her revision. Coordination and student's affairs department is taking due care of deferred case with the support of teachers and testing department.

#### 4.1.3.1 SUGGESTIONS FOR FUTURE FOLLOW-UPS

Keeping in view the positive and effective response of WhatsApp follow-up, it is suggested to adopt it in future as well. However, it will be required to align WhatsApp with the system/database. So, it is suggested to IT department to work on this aspect to see how we can align WhatsApp with system so that communication record can be available in system for future reference purpose.

#### 4.1.4 PTMs

As the session under review was mainly physical, so, prior intimation was provided to parents regarding schedule of PTM through SKANS Mobile App SMS and then, formal physical PTMs



were conducted at campus (31st August 2021 and 1st September 2021). So, coordinators and teachers met with the parents/students at campus, discussed progress of their child and took their feedback. 27/31 parents of btach#4 students attended the PTMs (Source report name: Parents Feedback-Details) and filled the feedback form. Overall, parents provided positive feedback about AFC teaching faculty and course progress.

#### 4.1.4.1 SUGGESTIONS FOR FUTURE PTMs

Keeping in view the prevailing COVID situation, it is strongly advised to conduct physical system-based PTMs as well as online PTMs i.e., wo physical meetings (one during session and one before end of session) plus monthly online PTMs through Zoom Meetings, and then keep proper record of those meeting in the form of Audio/Video recordings. It can be very effective and also very productive as live communication can be made from both sides and Parents can share their concerns as well. Further, these recording may be uploaded at SKANS portal for future reference.

These online PTMs may also be conducted after COVID phase as these are online and convenient for Parents to attend. Further, group PTMs could be very productive for identifying common issues and solving them.

To make PTMs more systematic, schedule may be shared with students/parents at the time of starting the respective batch.




#### 4.1.5 TEACHERS EVALUATION

However, this evaluation activity was identified ineffective as most of the students of batch#4 did not perform this activity (very high absent rate in teacher evaluation). This issue of low participation in teacher evaluation has also been reported in the last session as well (June 2021).

Teacher evaluation summary of each subject is presented in faculty section against relevant teacher.

#### 4.1.5.1 IDENTIFICATION OF PROBLEM

Although system-based teacher evaluation was conducted for batch#4, however, participation rate from students was low. The real purpose of teacher evaluation could not be achieved with low



participation from students. So, it is grey area and need serious attention of coordinators and management. However, suggestions for immediate implementation are provided in the below section.

#### 4.1.5.2 FUTURE RECOMMENDATIONS ON TEACHER EVALUATION

The high absence rate indicates lack of supervision from coordinators end during this activity. The coordinators need to make sure that all active students must submit teacher evaluation i.e., in case on a day if one student did not submit it, he/she must be instructed to do it next day. All students should be advised to take this activity seriously and participate.


To counter low attendance issue in teacher evaluation activity, prior intimation and strong follow ups should be made. It can be very effective and also very productive. It is also strongly advised to inform students about Teacher Evaluation through SKANS Mobile App at least 3 days before so that they can do the needful at the scheduled day and time. Similarly, reminder may also be sent in this regard to increase participation rate.

To make Teacher Evaluation more systematic, schedule may be shared with students at the time of starting the respective batch.




#### 4.1.7 CONVERSION RATE

#### Subject: AFC SEPTEMBER 2021 SESSION-TESTS/MOCKS DETAILS

The session under review was primarily physical, so, tests/mocks were conducted at campus. Teachers were advised to give prior intimation to the testing department to upload tests and students were also informed by teachers in advance during their classes and also on tests day through WhatsApp messages. All students were properly guided about the procedure to attempt tests. Further, individual guidance was also provided to those students who had very limited technical knowledge.

At least 7-8 Tests for each subject (mainly chapter wise) plus Mocks (after completion of syllabus/section) were conducted. Overall, students' attendance and performance in tests was satisfactory. Strong follow-ups (at teachers end, at coordinators end and at exam department end) were made to increase participation in tests/Mocks.

However, as discussed in above sections, some students opted for self-preparation at the end of session, so, did not join campus to attempt test/Mocks. They were instructed to attempt tests/Mocks online but they reported internet problems at their end and thus could not attempt tests/Mocks.

System generated tests statistics are available at the end of this report. Further, WhatsApp communication with the students regarding prior intimation of tests, intimation after uploading tests, and reminders to attempt tests/re-tests are also available if required. Moreover, system-based SMS were also sent to all absent students by head of governance department. Its record is also available in system and presented in next section.

Some new reports at portal should be developed to fulfill the requirements of this comprehensive session report. As, at present, so much work has to be done manually. Further, it is also suggested

to IT department to work on the technical issues in SKANS testing App. Two major issues are (i) Server Error and (ii) Significant difference in number of questions for each student of same batch/subject. These issues have been reported to IT department (Sir Aamir and Sir Salman) and they are working on it. However, second issue is creating a big problem as Testing App/portal displays large number of questions above 100/200/300/400 etc. which of course can't be attempted in one hour time/in one class and thus, students attempt maximum possible questions but system mark them fail by calculating percentage of marks with respect of total questions.



#### 5.1 TESTING SECTION

#### 5.1.1 AN OVERVIEW

For the period under discussion, strong efforts were made in terms of 'Testing' in order to follow LP testing schedule. For the record, testing was done at 100% level of effort at departmental level. Teachers tested the students as per LP and retests (re-uploading) were conducted accordingly. Students were intimated by the respective teachers (during classes) at least one day before the conduction of test and then, on test day, students were again informed and instructed to attempt test (in class as well as through WhatsApp). The efficiency of these tests at student level was at an approximate 80% (It would be higher if we exclude the student who deferred for December attempt or who missed tests at the end of session after completion of syllabus. This is due to the fact that students opted for self-preparation at the end of session.

#### 5.1.2 IDENTIFICATION OF PROBLEMS

It was mentioned in the last session (June Session 2021) content report that new web-based testing application/portal was developed which required low internet speed to operate smoothly. However, once the testing requirements increased, some technical issues were reported by students which were brought into notice of IT department.

First issue was an error named as "Server Error" and second error was related to difference in number of questions for each student of same batch/subject. The first error was considered as real/run time error and resolved immediately by the IT department whenever this error was reported to them. However, the second error was a major concern for all as Testing App/portal displays large number of questions above 100/200/300/400 etc. which of course can't be attempted in one hour time/in one class and thus, students attempt maximum possible questions but system mark them fail by calculating percentage of marks with respect of total questions.

So, it is a grey area and need serious attention of IT department. They are making sincere efforts to resolve this issue but it still exists.

#### 5.1.3 PRIOR INTIMATION TO STUDENTS

We made efforts to contact students and urged them to participate in testing through follow-ups at teacher level (Through WhatsApp Messages and Calls) and at department level as well (Through SKANS SMS Application as messages were sent to all absent students in Tests).

Students were informed by the respective teachers in advance about upcoming tests as per Lecture Plan during their online classes and then, on the test day, when tests were uploaded, a message



was again sent to the students by respective teacher through WhatsApp to attempt it as soon as possible.

In this session, with the support of Governance department, Exam department sent prior intimation to parents for Mocks Schedule. Exam department conducted Mocks between 11<sup>th</sup> September to 15<sup>th</sup> September 2021 and intimation was sent through SKANS Mobile App on 10<sup>th</sup> September 2021 regarding Mocks schedule to all parents (Batch#4 students).

#### 5.1.3.1 RE-TESTS/RE-MOCKS

Exam department re-uploaded the tests/mocks as and when required. Mainly, teachers were advised to ask exam department for re-uploading of tests/mocks which they did and all absent students were instructed to attempt it. This helped to increase students' participation in tests/mocks.

#### 5.1.3.2 STRONG FOLLOW-UP

Head of Governance, Mr. Qasim Shuja also actively sent messages through SKANS Mobile Application to absent students in each test (same day, night time) or next day (in morning time). This also helped to increase students' participation in tests. 405 system-based test absentee's messages (Source report name: SMS Log) were sent to the parents (April 27<sup>th</sup> 2021 to September 15<sup>th</sup> 2021).

Students were strictly advised by the respective teachers to attempt all tests. Re-Tests were allowed and absent students were again advised to attempt tests.

Details of system-based SMS sent to absent students in tests are presented below:

#### 5.1.3.3 DEVELOPMENT OF NEW COMPREHENSIVE REPORTS

Exam department and governance department has given input to IT department to develop new system-based reports where comparative analysis can be made about different dimensions like admissions comparison between different sessions, exam results comparison between different sessions, tests comparisons etc. At present, with our input, few reports have been developed but still due to absence of other required reports, so much work has to be performed manually.



#### 5.1.4 MAJOR FINDINGS

Despite the efforts from teachers, exam department and head of governance, some students did not appear in tests/Mocks due to different reasons like internet issues and health issues etc. Interestingly, most of the students who had low attendance in class and tests, have failed in ICAP Exam. Moreover, most of them have failed marginally like with a difference of 2/3/4 marks. So, low attendance in online classes and tests lead to low performance in ICAP Exam. It signifies that if they had attended classes properly and attempted tests/Mocks, they would have achieved better results. Details are available in the Excel file.

Testing ratio of this session at conduction level 100% whereas student's attendance in testing was around 80%. Therefore, it is recommended that management or exam department take serious steps and carry out strong timely follow ups through calls to students/parents.

#### 5.1.5 INPUT FOR FURTHER IMPROVEMENT IN TESTING/REPORTING

Low students' participation in tests suggest that more efforts are required from coordinators, teachers and exam department.

It is also strongly advised to inform Parents/students about upcoming tests at least 2 days before the test date through SKANS Mobile App. Similarly, reminder may also be sent in this regard to increase participation rate.

Further, at present, system-based reports does not fulfill all the requirements of this comprehensive session report and so much work has to be done manually. So, it is strongly advised to IT department to develop all related reports as discussed in the above section. We can significantly increase the efficiency of our Portal by developing new reports as data is already available in the system, we just need to extract data through reports in appropriate format and then perform, required analysis.


ICAP exams for AFC September 2021 session were held from September 18, 2021 to September 28, 2021. The result of this exam was declared by ICAP on 12<sup>th</sup> October, 2021. To compile the results for session September-2021, two sources were mainly used to extract results related data i.e., ICAP PDF result file (main result file) and ICAP E-Sheets (to check students marks in fail subjects).

During the result review of the session under consideration, four categories of variables i.e., Drop, Defer, Pass, and Fail, were identified. The relative number of variables identified along with their percentages can be seen in the table/graph presented below:

The result summary presented above depicts that total 109 papers were enrolled for September 2021 attempt (31 students). However, out of these, 102 papers (94%, 30 students) were attempted in September attempt. The remaining 2 students (6%, 7 papers) did not appear in exams due to different reasons which are mentioned in the previous sections. Further, an overall average 83% (90 papers out of 109) pass percentage was achieved and only 17% (12 out of 109 papers) students failed in September 2021 ICAP exams. Overall, out of 31 students, 25 students cleared AFC (81%) and an overall, 60% conversion rate was achieved.

AFC September 2021 session overall result is satisfactory as it is above than 80% in aggregate. However, efforts should be made to achieve 100% result in all subjects and 90%-95% pass percentage should be the minimum acceptable level at SKANS.

Relevant supporting evidences can be found in the file/Database reports. All these procedures and evidences are being documented in Internal ICAP Result KPIs file for the session September 2021 attempt for future reference and guidelines.

Academic and Administrative issues are also addressed in different sections of this report along with future directions. Moreover, this report is available for session end academic audit by an external party if required. All under review session results have been discussed with the relevant



teachers. Our teachers or relevant subject team can discuss results with Principal if required for discussion and input regarding result session under review and suggestions for improvements in the upcoming sessions.

#### **Functional English (FE) Subject:**

Total enrolled students in FE subject were 17. However, out of these, 15 appeared in the ICAP September 2021 Exam. 1 student (Seemab Massey) deferred due to health issues as she got injured. Similarly, 1 student (Ubedullah) dropped 3 papers.

Overall, 13 students passed (out of 15 appeared) FE exam and only 2 students failed in FE from this batch. They both had low attendance problem. Details of these two fail students are available in the last sections. An overall 87% pass percentage (13% fail) was achieved in FE paper.

#### **Business Communication (BC) Subject:**

Total enrolled students in BC subject were 30. However, out of these, 29 appeared in the ICAP September 2021 Exam.

Overall, 28 students passed (out of 29 appeared) BC exam and only 1 student failed in BC from this batch. Details of that one fail student is available in the last section. An overall 97% pass percentage (3% fail) was achieved in BC paper.

#### **Introduction to Information Technology (IT) Subject:**

Total enrolled students in IT subject were 31. However, out of these, 29 appeared in the ICAP September 2021 Exam.

Overall, 25 students (out of 29 appeared) passed IT exam and only 4 students failed in IT from this batch. Details of these 4 fail students are available in the last section. An overall 86% pass percentage (14% fail) was achieved in IT paper.



#### **Quantitative Methods (QMT) Subject:**

Total enrolled students in QMT subject were 31. However, out of these, 29 appeared in the ICAP September 2021 Exam.

Overall, 24 students passed (out of 29 appeared) QMT exam and only 5 students failed in QMT from this batch. Details of these 5 fail students are available in the last section. An overall 83% pass percentage (17% fail) was achieved in QMT paper.

#### **Overall AFC Pass:**

25 students (out of 29 appeared) of Batch-4 has passed overall AFC exam i.e., 86% students of Batch-4 cleared AFC.

#### **Conversion Status:**

Batch-4 has 60% conversion rate in CAF-1.
